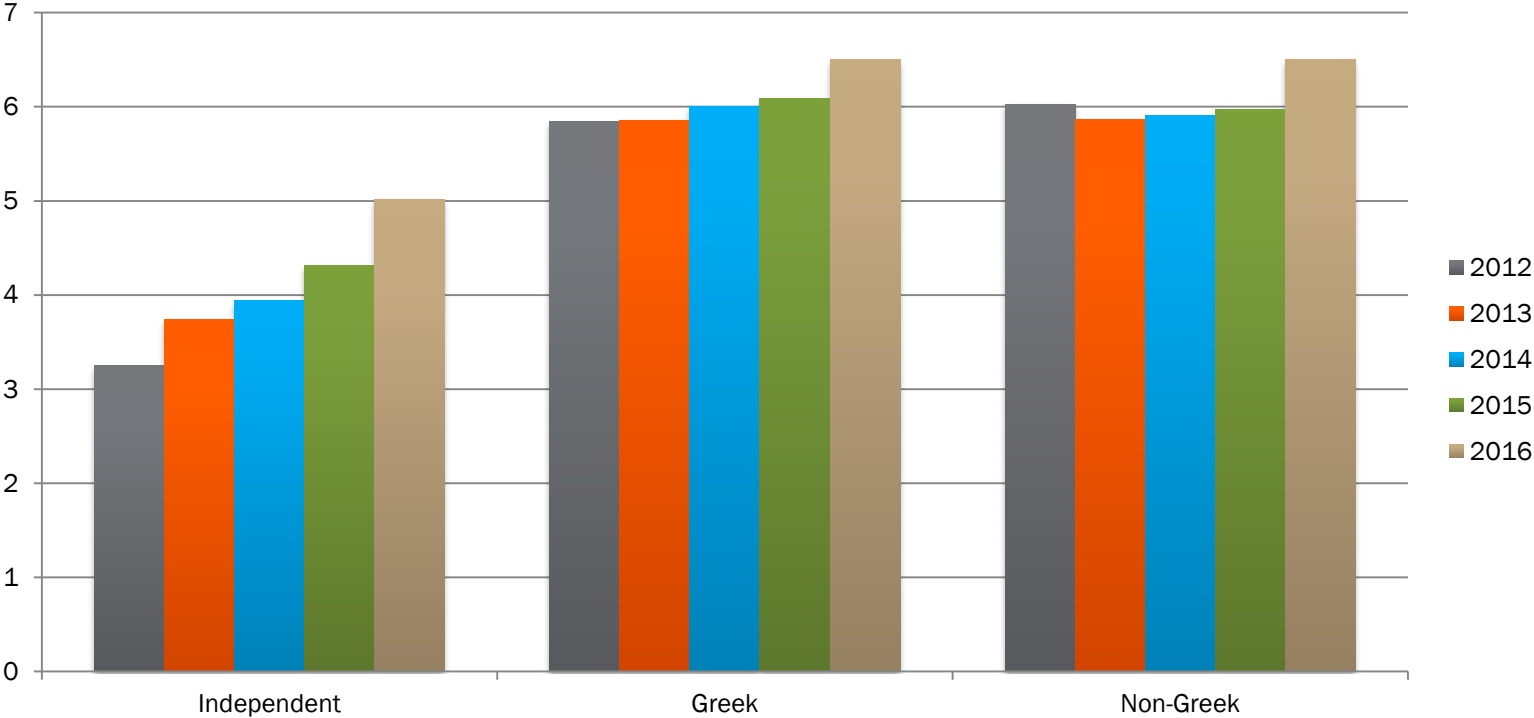
# DUKE HOUSES VERSUS QUAD MODEL - WHAT CHANGED???

Community size 400-1000 (6 quads and Central)	Community size 30-120 (30 independent houses)

Sophomores live on West	Five hundred sophomores on Central
20 SLGs (3 on Central, no sororities)	42 SLGs (22 on Central, 10 sororities)
Central 13% SLG population	Central Over 70% SLG population
Seniority primary for assignment	Right of Return primary for assignment
Student select open bed in any house	Student assigned to house
Maximum block size of eight	Maximum block size of six

68% of beds independent	56% of beds independent

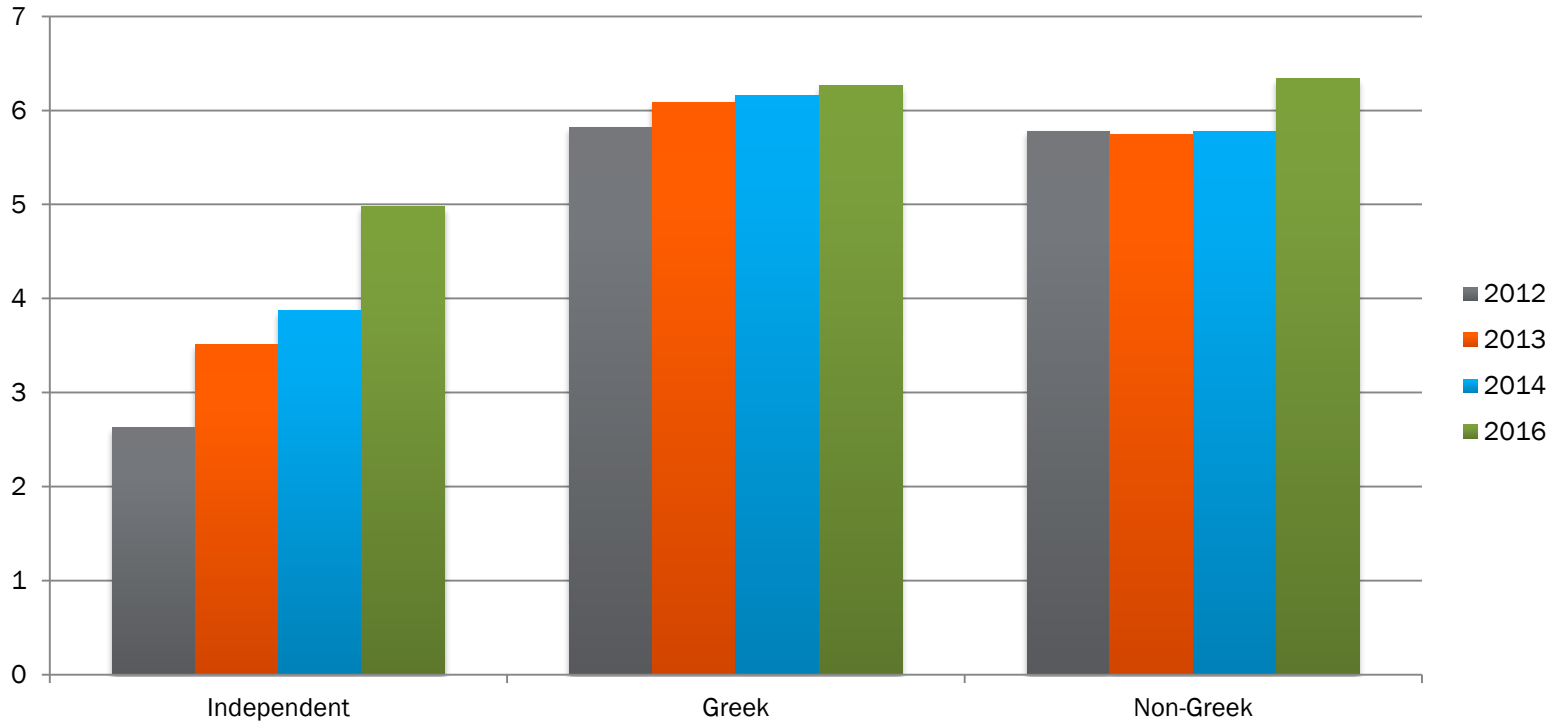
# GOALS FOR DUKE HOUSES

  - Exposure to and interactions with students from diverse backgrounds
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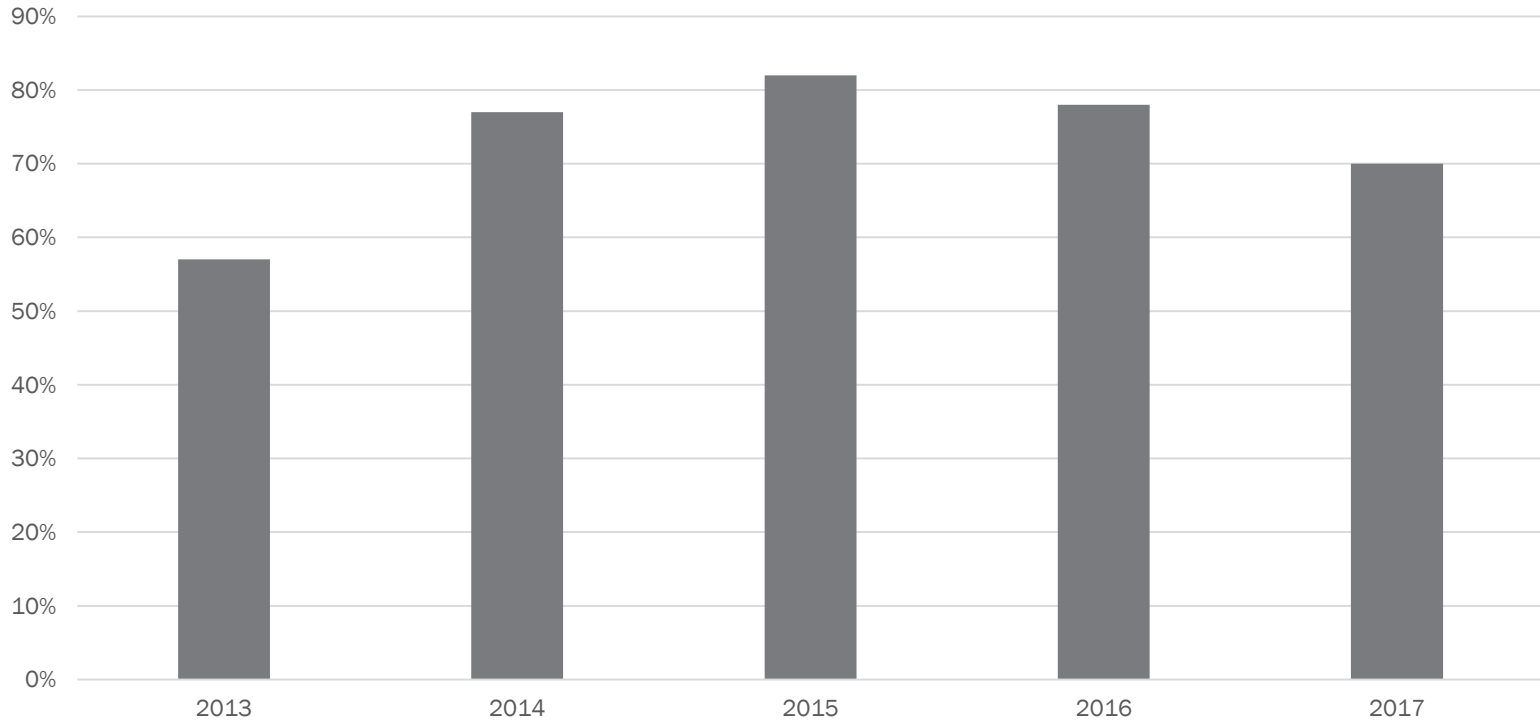

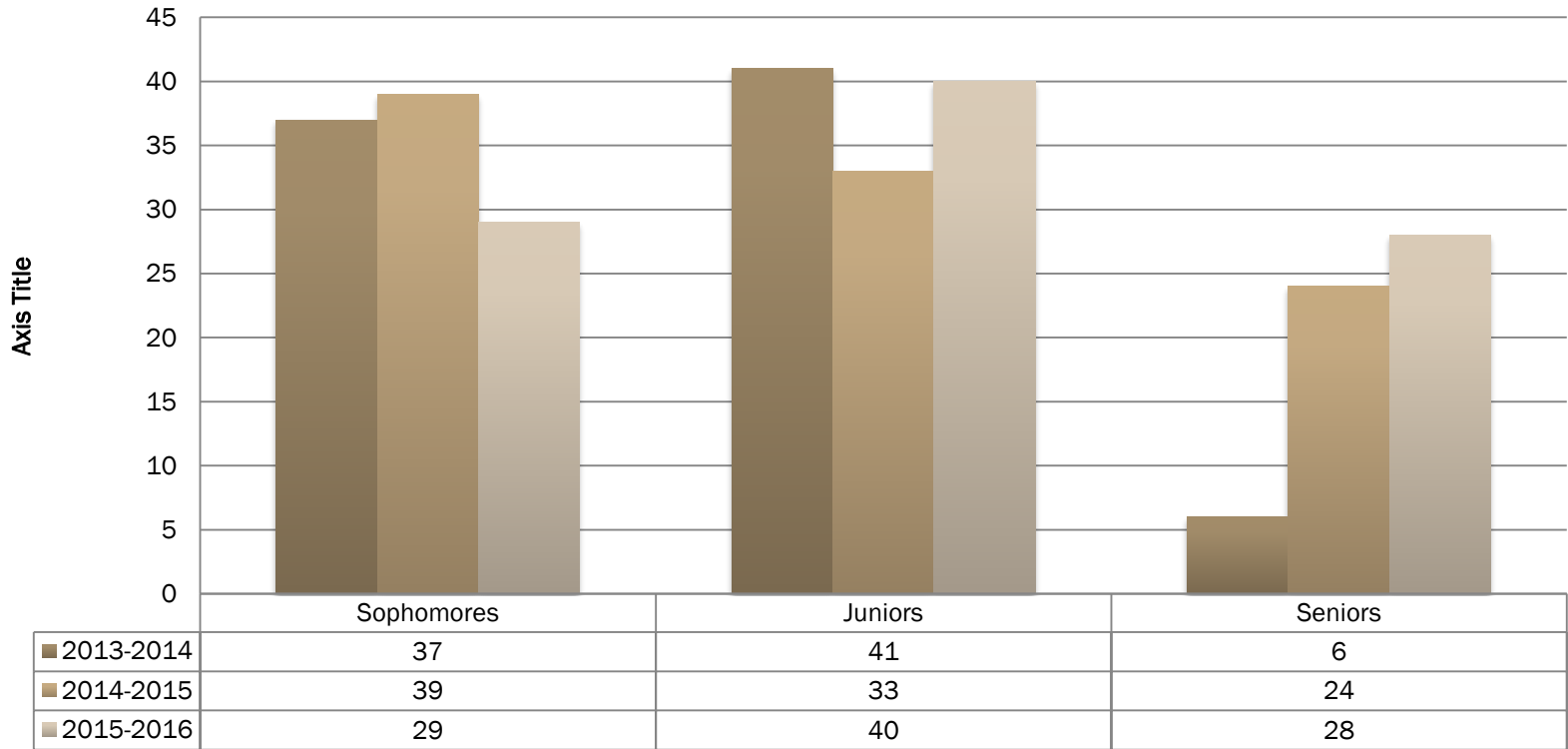
# CONNECTION/AFFINITY WITH HOUSE



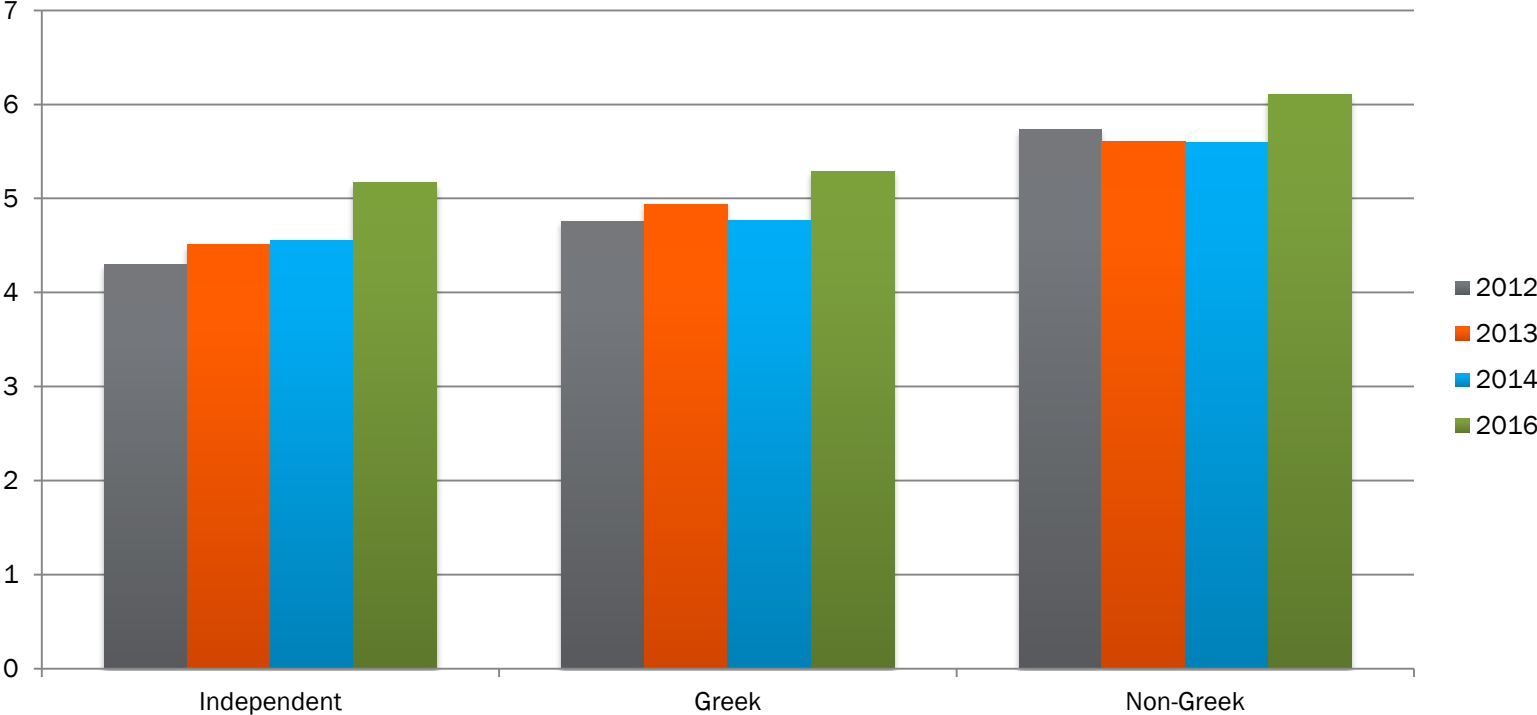
# COMMUNITY CONTINUITY – RIGHT OF RETURN



# INDEPENDENT HOUSE COUNCIL OFFICERS CLASS YEAR COMPARISON

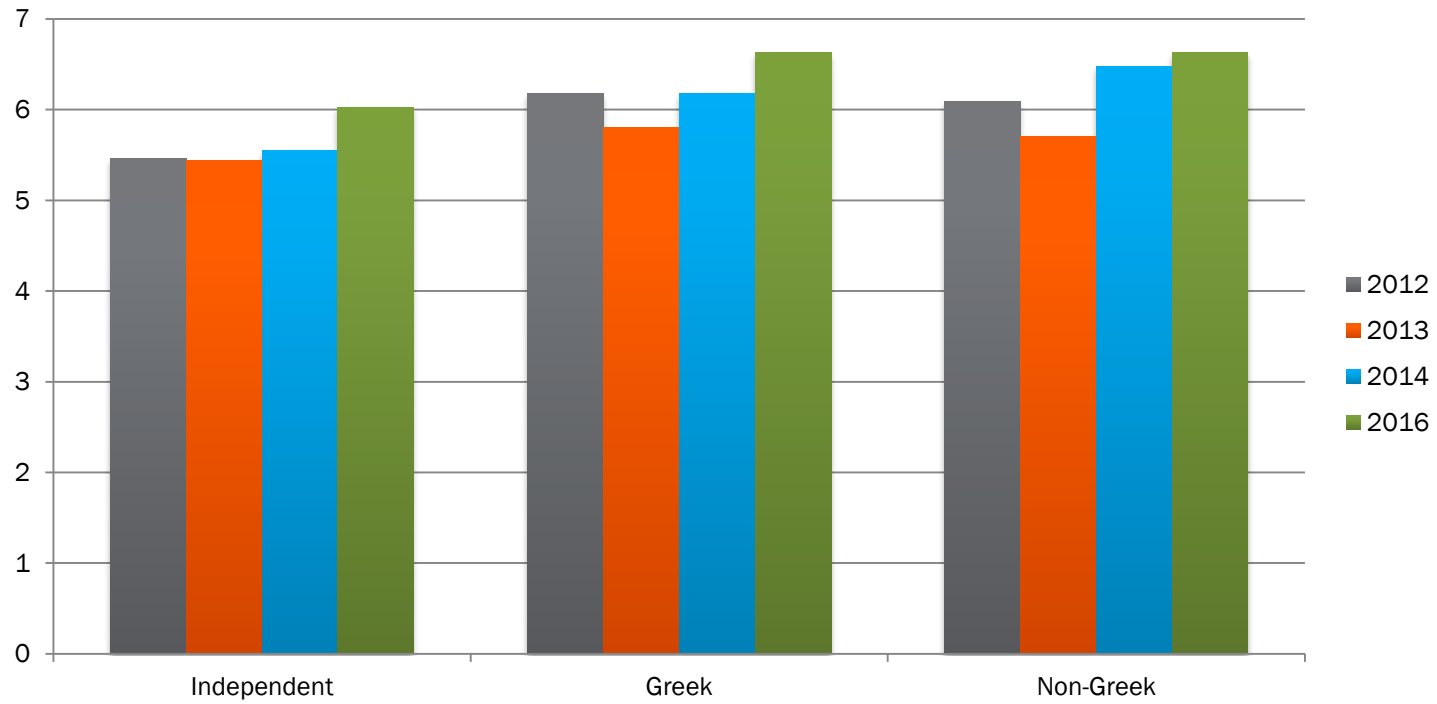

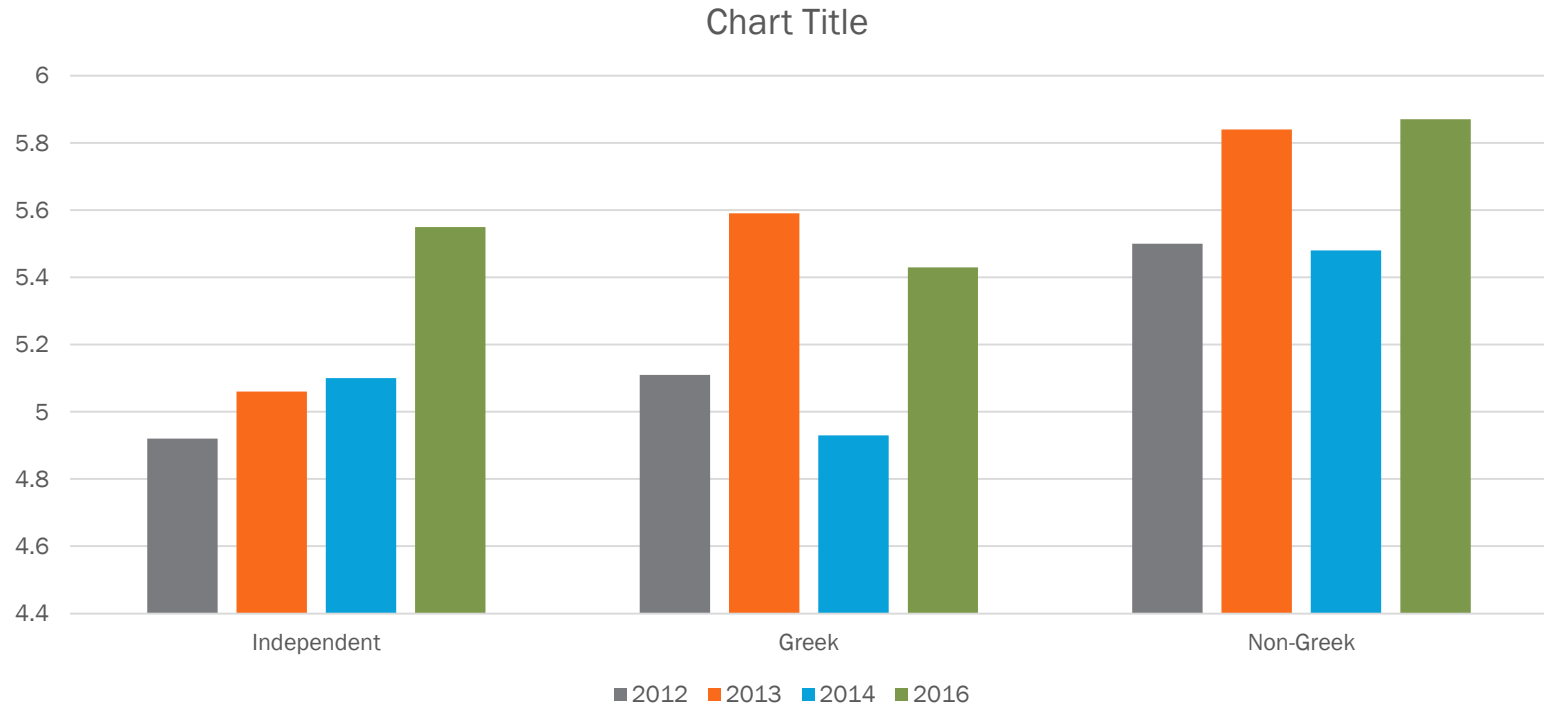
# FEEL ACCEPTED BY OTHERS IN THE HOUSE



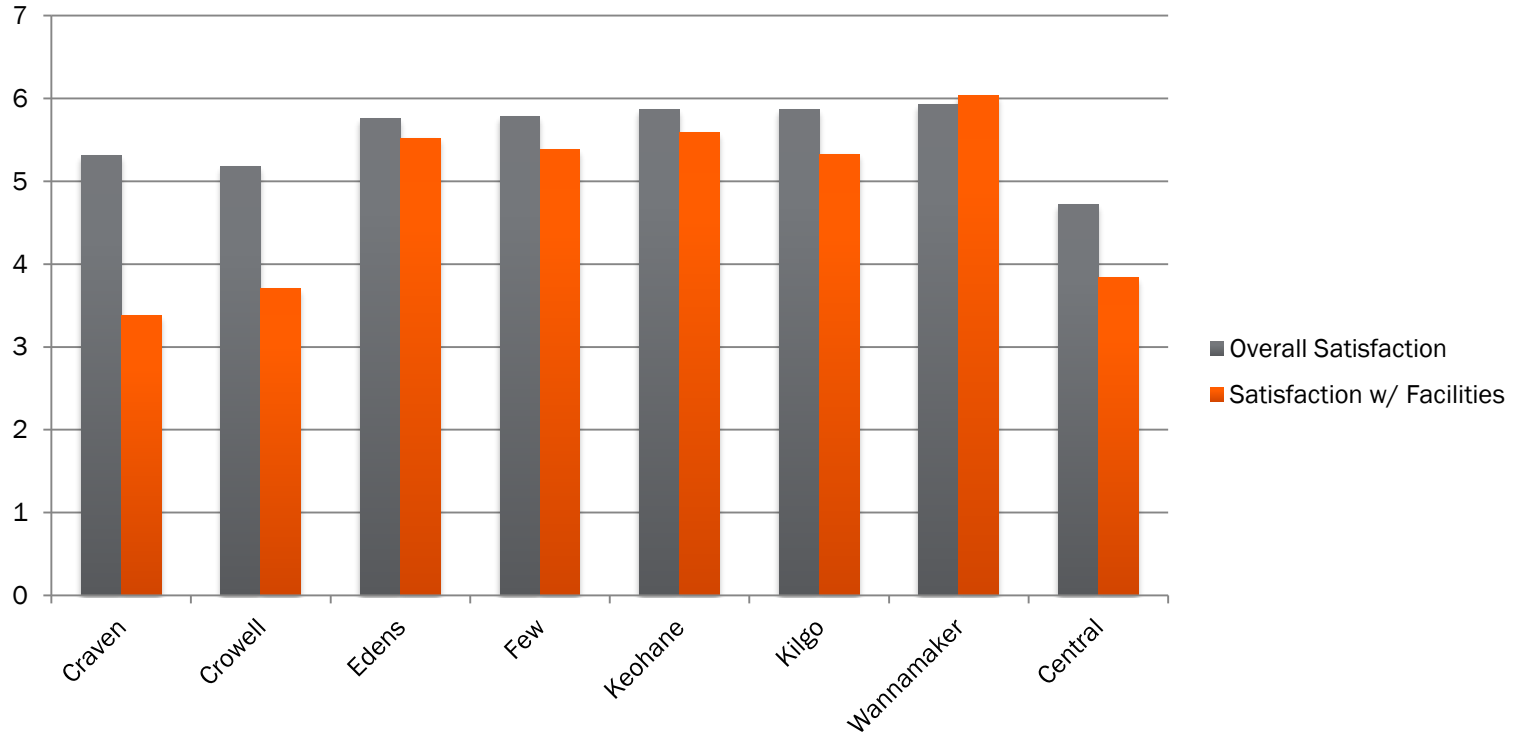
# HOUSES IN WHICH AT LEAST 40% OF MEMBERS IDENTIFY AS PEOPLE OF COLOR (FALL, 2016)
